



Key factors for succesful exchange

- Long term committment
- Respect customary practices
- Communicate on equal terms
- Modesty in relation to ones own knowwledge system
- Ethical code of conducts
- Free Prior Informed Concent



Key factors for succesful exchange (cont)

- Include the elders and the youth of the community
- Recognize women's knowledge



Key factors for successful exchange (cont)


 Learning and knowledge also relate to spiritual belief systems, including locally based understanding of the relationships between nature, humans and deities





Key conclusions

- Indigenous, traditional, local and scientific knowledge systems are different manifestations of valid and useful knowledge systems which can contribute to the sustainable management of ecosystems
- Significant potential for communitybased knowledge to complement and advance current scientific understandings, while contributing to sustaining cultural integrity and fulfilling local needs.
- There is a window of opportunity to release that potential now in e.g IPBES.
